Cancer Prevalence Across Vertebrates. Cancer Discov (2025) 15 (1): 227–244.

Evolution has discovered mechanisms for suppressing cancer in a wide variety of species. By analyzing veterinary necropsy records, we can identify species with exceptionally high or low cancer prevalence. Interestingly, this study found that white faced saki monkeys, pygmy marmosets, squirrel monkeys and Sulawesi macaques have very low cancer prevalence.
